- Click on the **Player Login** tab in the top right corner
- Enter your email and password (If you've forgotten your password, you can reset it at login)
- Click on **Add New Entry** at the bottom of the Your Electricity Readings table
- Enter a meter reading (our first competition update stepped through how to read your meter), *or* daily average (if you have received a bill recently this will be shown).
- Check the team and zone scoreboards to see how its changed.

### **Energy Savings Tip – Heat yourself, not the planet.**

Tip: Get snug and cosy with clothing layers and blankets before cranking up the heat.

Mother Nature has been testing our commitment to Climate Clubs lately. The constant wind, rain and cold are temptations to use excessive heating at home. But as exemplary Climate Clubbers, we do the simple things before reverting to old electricity sapping habits.

Remember to look for ways at home to stop the cold from coming in rather than fighting it with heating. Here are some actions you can take;

- Close the curtains or blinds to keep the heat in, pelmets will prevent cold air circulating around the windows and into the room
- · Seal the gaps under door to keep the cold air out
- On cold nights layer up! Warm clothes are not just for outside. Warm and cosy beanies, socks and dressing gowns keep you warm around the house.
- Use a hot water bottle. This is a fast way to get you warm and comfortable on those cold winter nights (best with a cup of tea!).
- If you have an electric blanket, use it to warm your bed (although flannelette sheets and hot water bottles are also good).

Fact: It's a fact: Every one degree increase in heater thermostat setting can increase the heating component of your power bill by up to 15%
