

Competition Update No.19 – 23 November 2011

Who has won Climate Clubs 2011?

Sorry, we can't tell you just yet. But we are in the process of calculating the results to share with you by **early December!** In the meantime, we thought you'd like to know why the final results might be different to what is currently shown on the scoreboard. Until we calculate the final scores (using your actual energy use data from our friends at Ausgrid and Endeavour Energy), the scores up on the website only reflect the energy-saving activity of the **227** players who have updated their energy use online during the competition.

This means the actual final scores could end up being different from the current score on the website. Here's a tally of the number and % of players from each Club who have updated their own electricity use online during the competition. The higher the percentage of updaters, the more accurate the current score is likely to be.

Want to earn extra \$\$ for your school? Keep saving energy!



The Climate Clubs 2011 Competition may officially be over, with results to be announced soon, but that's no reason to fall back into energy-hungry habits and routines. Climate Clubs will continue to count any electricity savings that Climate Clubbers make for any power bill you receive until **15 February** towards the final \$ amount that will go to your school's P&C Association (equivalent to 3c/kWh saved by your Club). In March 2012, we receive our second batch of electricity use data from our electricity provider partners, which will allow us to calculate exactly how much money each Club has earned through their

savings.

So while your electricity savings from now until then won't affect the final scores, they will increase that \$\$ amount that will go straight to your school's P&C. Last year participating schools raised over \$300 each, so keep saving energy at home to fundraise for your school!
